

# Feedback from Newick CofE Primary School In school eSafety day

- Fewer children than we normally see have technology in their bedroom
- Some children have their own Youtube accounts and have seen nasty, offensive comments
- http://youtubeforchildren.com- from Feb 23 and Android Youtube App
- Many Y3 students know their parents PIN other students know this and some parental passwords
- Students appeared unsure about what happens to their shared online images
- Many students have same user name and passwords for multiple online accounts- password tree?
- ❖ Eg password= p@ssword, pa55word,p@55word etc
- ❖ Y4/5 advised to google themselves for their own 'digital footprint'
- Many children are engaging in online games with people they do not know in the real world. Some said they have been asked personal questions.
- Students did suggest they would know if someone was lying to them however when pressed it was obvious they began to think about HOW they know someone. Students were asked to think about ways in which they would know if they were being lied to online.

## E-Safety checks in your home...

- Do you have a wireless network?
- i) Is it encrypted?
- ii) Who knows the access password?
- Do you have robust and regularly update anti-virus, anti-spyware, anti-malware, and firewall products?
- Do you have any work/business information on your home PC?
- Do you use your own USB memory or flash drives?
- Do you have a social networking presence, and if so, what does it say about you and your profession?

- Children's and young people's digital life
- ❖ Being a 'good' digital citizen not just a bystander
- 4 major ISP Internet Service Providers covering 86% of all Internet connections

#### BT,SKY, TALK TALK, VIRGIN MEDIA

- ❖ ISP providers have now changed the visibility of settings on new routers and active choices by the individual have to be made to create 'family friendly systems'
- Splash controls on adult sites
- Screen shot then report it- do not delete

Do you have individual user log-ons for each member of your household?


User Accounts- Is access restricted?

- ALL computer/connected technology costs money
- WHY would anyone invest £1000s and often far more, and let you play with it for nothing?
- ASK yourself.....WHAT'S IN IT FOR THEM?
  - Information IS money.

- Children (and sometimes parents) really think that....
- Their activities online cannot be tracked
- They are "fireproof"
- Problems only happen to other people
- Deleting a set of nasty messages is often the first action they take.







My name is "ZIP IT". I remind you NEVER to give personal information out over the internet.

Hi. I am "Block It". My job is to remind you that you can always ask an adult to BLOCK websites that you don't like OR people who are being nasty to you.

My name is "Flag It". I want you to make a HUGE fuss if you are ever bullied online.
