Roles and Responsibilities policy

Responsibilities of the Forest School Leader

- 1. To work with class teachers to plan and lead Forest School activities which incorporate curriculum subjects, British Values and learning survival skills.
- 2. The Forest School Leader will ensure time is allowed for free play.
- 3. To ensure that planned activities are within the capabilities of the children taking part, amending plans to provide an inclusive curriculum in its broadest sense.
- 4. The Forest School Leader is responsible for choosing a suitable site for the programme.
- 5. The Forest School Leader should continually assess the site for other members of the public accessing the area.
- 6. To take responsibility for discipline during Forest School sessions (see Behaviour Policy).
- 7. To have an up to date First Aid qualification, ensure a well equipped first aid kit (including epi-pens and inhalers) is taken to the site and restocked after use.
- 8. To ensure that all participants follow the Clothing Policy.
- 9. Ensure that all risk assessments are up to date including; site, daily, ongoing and activity risk assessments. The Forest School leader must then manage these risks and ensure that all adults are aware of the risks and how to control them; ensuring that everyone is safe at all times.
- 10. To ensure all Forest School policies are regularly reviewed and that review is informed by observations and developing knowledge of the Forest School setting.
- 11. It is the leader's responsibility to cancel the sessions in bad weather (storms and winds Beaufort Scale 5 and above) when it would put people in danger to attend.
- 12. Ensure that the legal pupil adult ration is maintained.
- 13. The Forest School Leader will take care that food preparation, cooking and eating is hygienic and that the participants have the opportunity to eat or drink where appropriate.
- 14. Ensure that all adults follow safeguarding procedures to ensure that the children are safe and that they are briefed on how to deal with disclosures.
- 15. To assist with the toileting of children if they request help.

Responsibilities of Accompanying Staff

- 1. To take an active role in Forest School activities and assist with any discipline issues within the group (see Behaviour Policy)
- 2. To assist with the safety of walking children to and from the Forest School location.
- 3. Support the leader to continually assess the site for other members of the public accessing the area.
- 4. To assist with the Forest School Leader in ensuring equipment meets safety standards and to report any concerns about the state of equipment immediately.
- 5. To assist the Forest School Leader in teaching children to maintain their own and others' health and safety.
- 6. To report accidents or hazards to the Forest School Leader immediately.
- 7. To take responsibility for making themselves aware of safety issues, such as the whereabouts of the first aid kit.
- 8. If the member of staff has a first aid qualification, they can take responsibility for administering first aid, recording and reporting the information as described in

the First Aid policy.

- 9. To assist with the toileting of children if they request help.
- 10. To provide their own suitable outdoor clothing and footwear if able to do so.

Responsibility of accompanying adults

- 1. To play with and assist the children in their learning in either focused activities or through free play.
- 2. To model appropriate use of language, manners and respect for each other.
- 3. To model the Forest School rules for health and safety.
- 4. As appropriate, to record information for the Forest School leader of comments the children make about their learning.
- 5. To bring appropriate clothing and footwear to Forest School sessions.

Responsibilities of the Children

- 1. To take personal responsibility for their own safety as well as the safety of others
- 2. To listen to and follow safety information given to them.
- 3. To bring appropriate clothing and footwear to Forest School sessions.
